

¡ESTAR!



The -AR verbs you have conjugated so far have all been "regular" verbs. That means that they all follow the same pattern when they are conjugated:

To review- 1. You take off the ending (-ar)

2 . You add the ending that matches with the subject of the sentence.

Verbs that do not follow a regular pattern are called "irregular" verbs.

"Estar" (to be) is an irregular verb because the *yo* form doesn't follow a regular pattern and because the forms *estás, está,* and *están* require accent marks.

Use the verb *estar* to talk about:

- 1. How someone feels
- 2. Where someone is located

VOSOTROS ESTÁIS

ÉL/ELLA/UD. ESTÁ

ELLOS/ELLAS/UDS. ESTÁN

** REMEMBER: For how you feel and where you are, always use the verb ESTAR!
