

# Word Order: Placement of Adjectives

In Spanish, adjectives usually come after the noun they describe.

Look at the following example:

Lola is an **artistic girl**.

Lola es una **chica artística**.

Here is a simple formula you can use to write sentences in Spanish:

**Subject + Verb + Article + Noun + Adjective**

Let's translate a couple sentences:

Arturo is a lazy boy.

Nadia is a studious girl.

(*Arturo es un \_\_\_\_\_*)

(*Nadia es una \_\_\_\_\_*)

To make a sentence negative, you simply add a “no” between the **subject** and the **verb**.

Arturo is not a lazy boy.

↓      ✗      ↓      ✗

Arturo no es un chico perezoso.
